- Remove fine dust from behind the filter screen
- Remove oils and stain build up from inside radiator
- Sanitize inside radiator
- Internal drain is flushed
- Fan blades cleaned
- Reassemble, test and check noise levels
- Clean condensers
- Check for any refrigerant leaks
- Clean intake screens
- Apply cleaning solutions to fins and coil
- Clean and check fan blades


reduce behaviours. When needed, we work with the class team and therapists to come up with personalised plans.

Sharing our learning...


Students in our Manurewa East D2 satellite have been taking part in food therapy sessions.
