

Ākonga 8C's

This is a key part of our Local curriculum development.

Over the past year we have consulted with whānau and staff to decide what is important for our ākonga to learn so they are well prepared for life beyond school.

This is a visual representation of the 8 priorities identified. The whai (stingray) connects us with our pepeha and environment. The koru in the tail represents growth and our syndicate pathway. The patterns on the wings show our ākonga cultures. The values link into the 8C's and the koru design in the centre values whānau and the school working together to nurture our ākonga, with aroha, and with space to set them on their own journeys.

The next step is to further define the 8C's and the specific skills and understandings our ākonga need to grow in these areas.

We would like to hear ideas from our community and will send out a survey. This started as a 'graduate profile' but we felt that this did not fit our school as our ākonga are so diverse and we want our whai to represent a journey rather than a destination.

If anyone has knowledge or stories about whai in our area we would love to hear them.

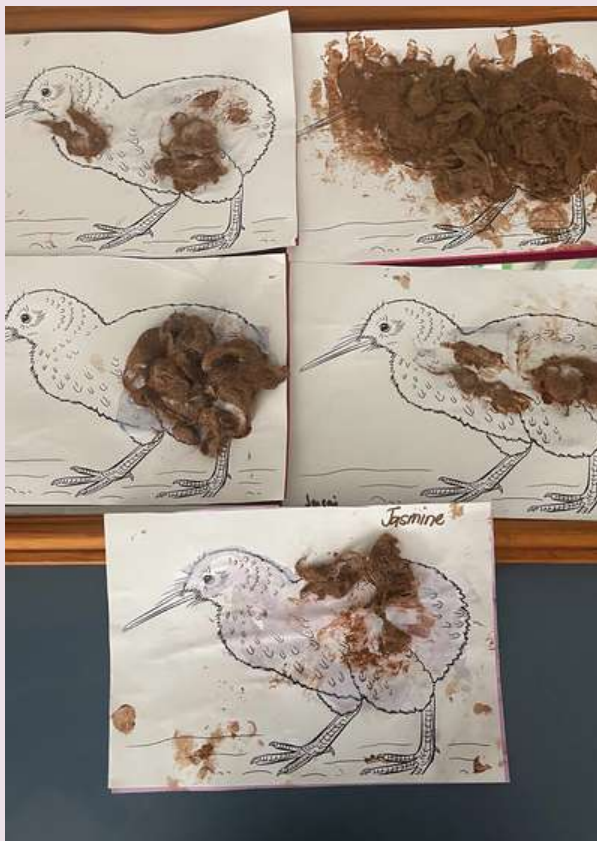

School Holiday Programme

The School holiday programme based at Rosehill School is staffed by an amazing group of community Support workers and it is run by Disability support provider **Spectrum Care** (www.spectrumcare.org.nz).

Our programme offers a wide range of fun activities such as swimming, Trampolining, 10-pin bowling, nature walks, ferry, train and museum trips, Music, arts and crafts, and much more.

The School Holiday Programme operates from 8.30am to 4.30pm – Monday to Friday, usually in the first week of the April, July and October school holidays but over the summer holidays, we run in the middle two weeks of January. Usually, the bookings for the children open two weeks out from the programme starting.

Costs: we charge \$117.40 per day or x1 carer support day + \$30 top up from families. This is invoiced after the programme finishes. There are no activity fees charged on top of this.
